

# Catlery's cleaner

**M**OST people use their own tablespoons to serve pet food, and many have marked it as the pet's spoon so they don't use it for their own food.

All pet owners know the feeling when they get pet food on their hands because the spoon is too short for the can.

Australian designer Belinda Jennings has come up with the solution — muttlery and catlery kitchenware for serving pet food.

The design includes a longer handle measured specifically to reach the bottom of the can without having to reach in with the hand, and a flat edge to scrape the remaining contents from the bottom and side of the can.

Spoons are available 22cm long for small to medium dog and cat-food tins, and 26cm long for 1.2kg dog food tins.

The spoon, and a matching cup for measuring and serving dry food, are made of stainless steel and decorated with laser-engraved paw prints.
